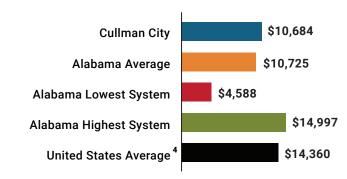

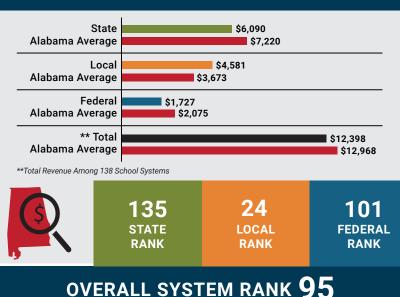

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

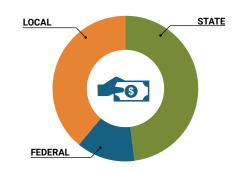
Cullman City Revenue Sources

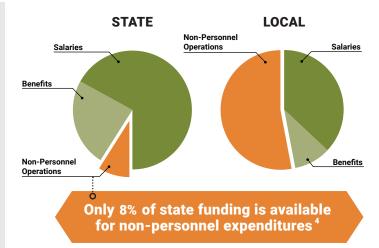
