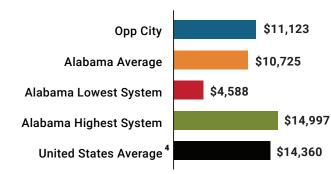

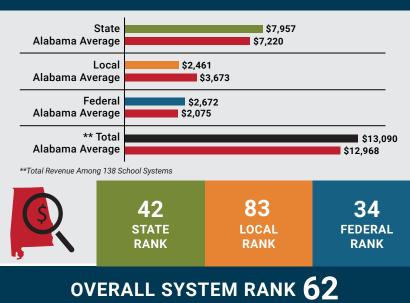

## **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**

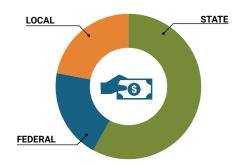
#### Opp City Revenue Sources
