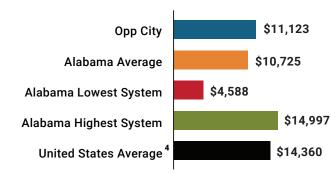

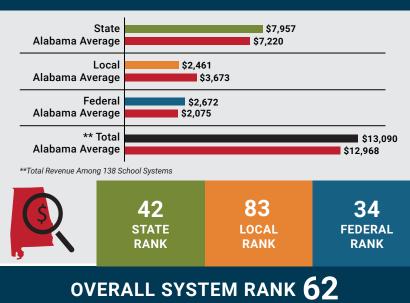

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

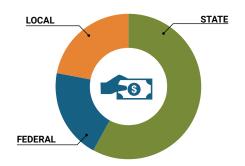
Opp City Revenue Sources
