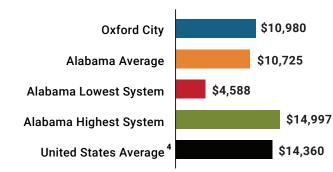

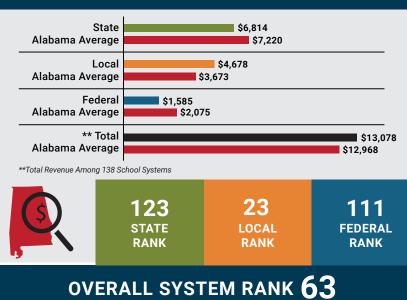

#### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**

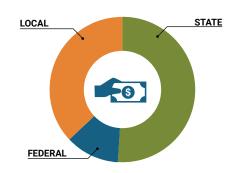
#### **Oxford City Revenue Sources**

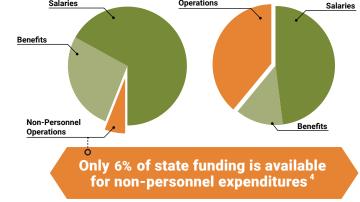
