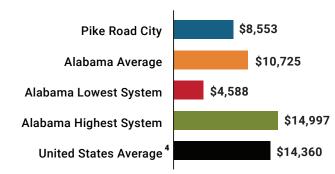

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

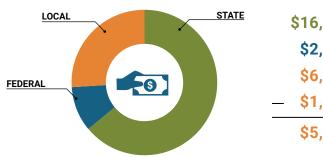
