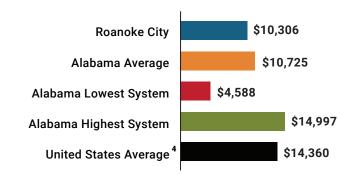

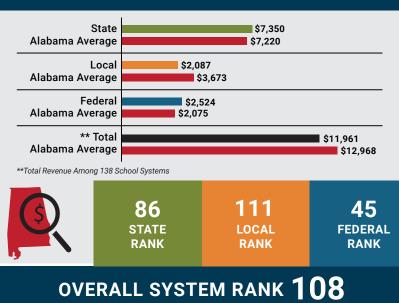

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

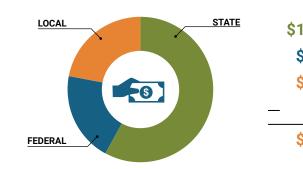
Roanoke City Revenue Sources
