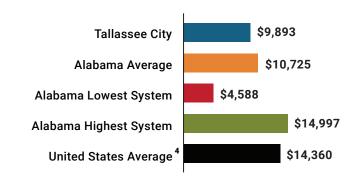

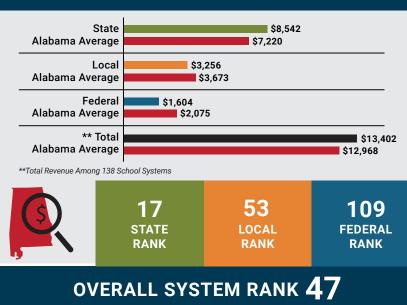

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

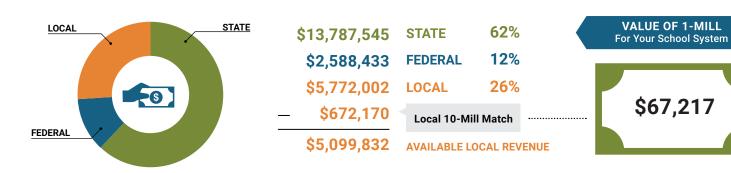
Tallassee City Revenue Sources
