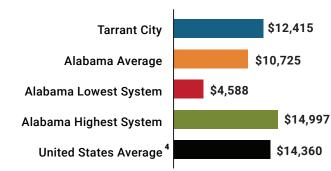

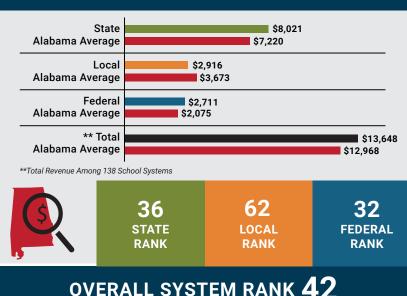

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

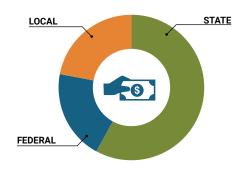
Tarrant City Revenue Sources
