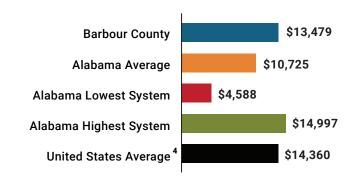

### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**

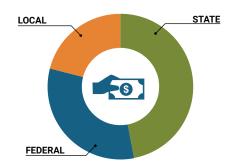
#### Barbour County Revenue Sources
