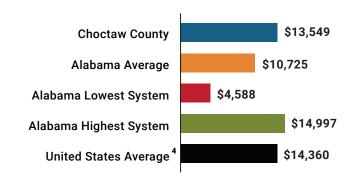

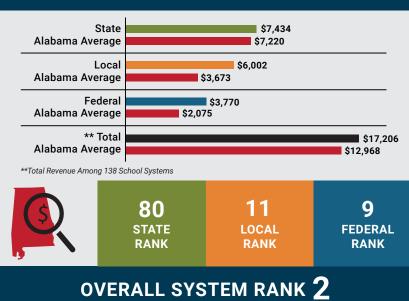

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

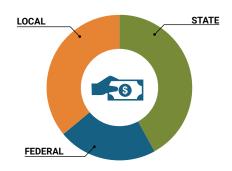
Choctaw County Revenue Sources
