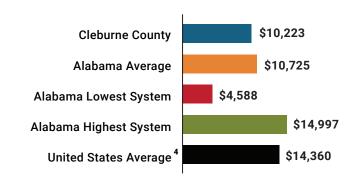

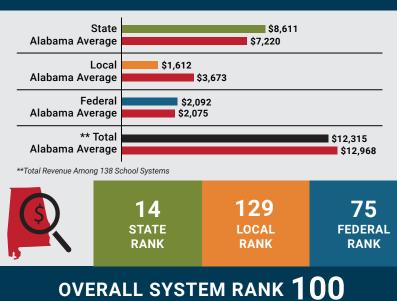

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

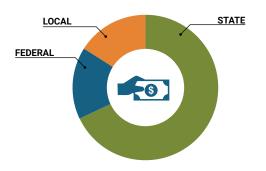
Cleburne County Revenue Sources
