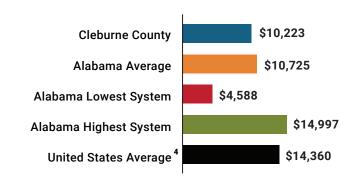

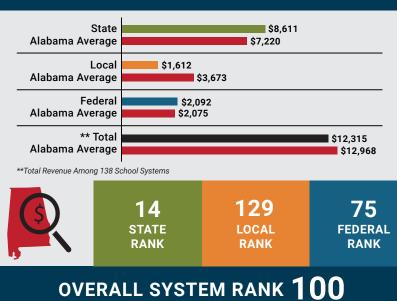

### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**

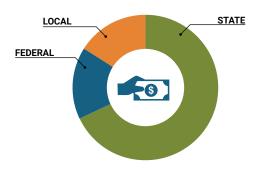
#### **Cleburne County Revenue Sources**
