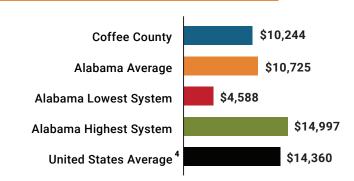

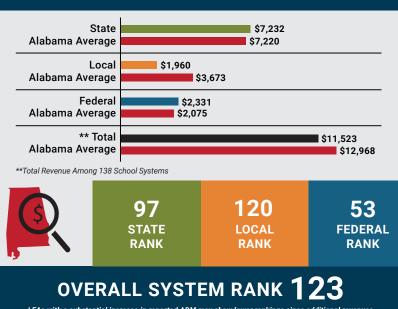

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

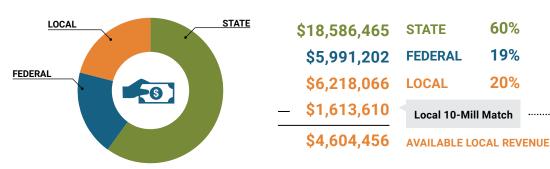
Coffee County Revenue Sources
