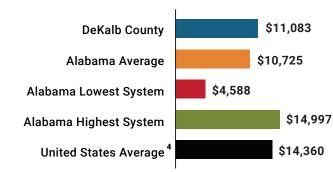

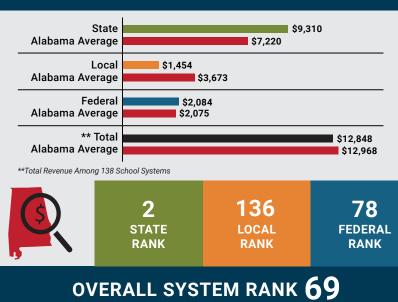

## **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**

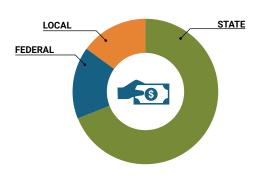
#### DeKalb County Revenue Sources
