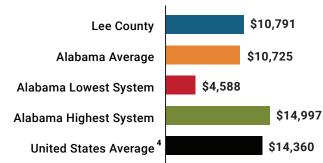

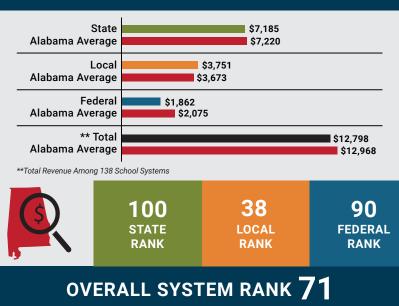

#### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**

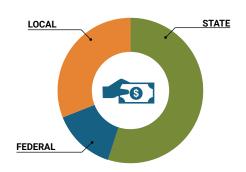
#### Lee County Revenue Sources

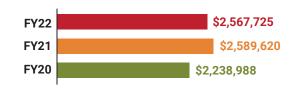
