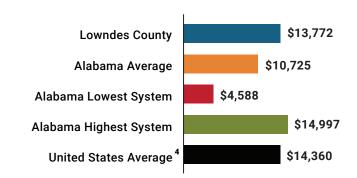

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

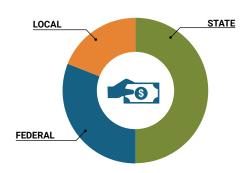
Lowndes County Revenue Sources
