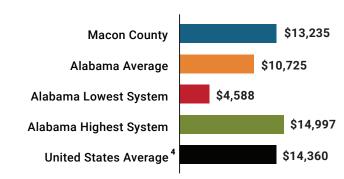

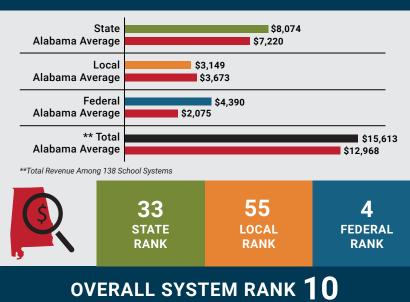

Per-Pupil Revenue Sources

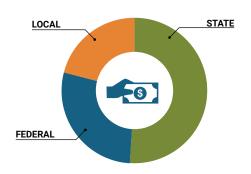
Macon County Revenue Sources
