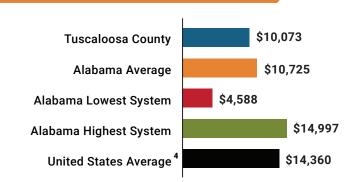

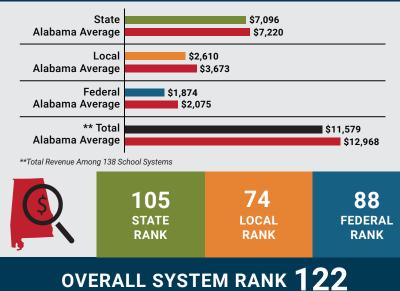

### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**

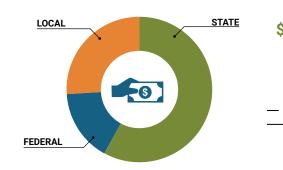
# Tuscaloosa County Revenue Sources
