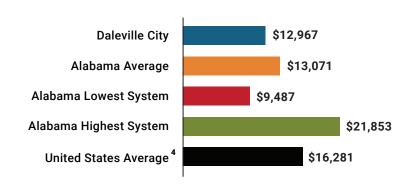

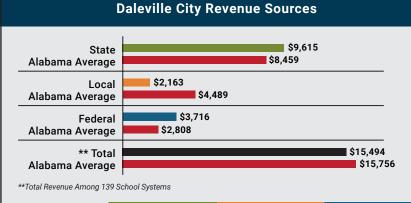

#### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**





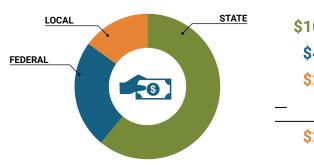
## OVERALL SYSTEM RANK 75

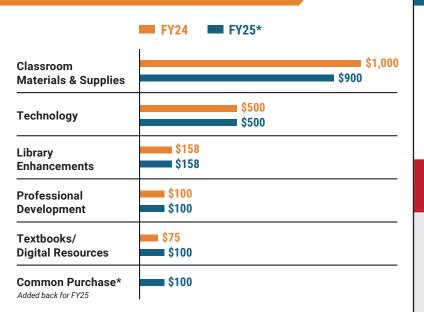
