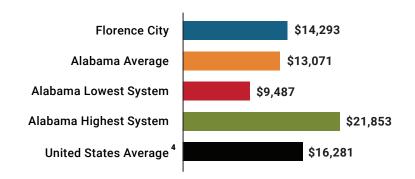

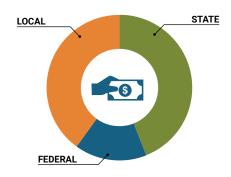


# OVERALL SYSTEM RANK 18

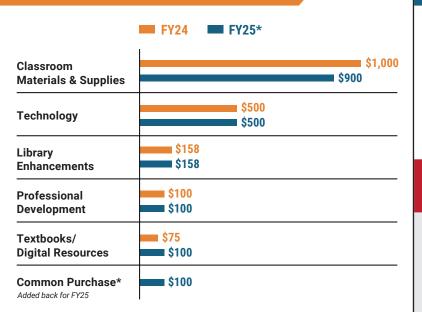
