






School System Spending

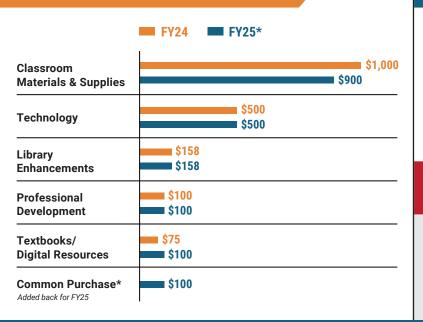
