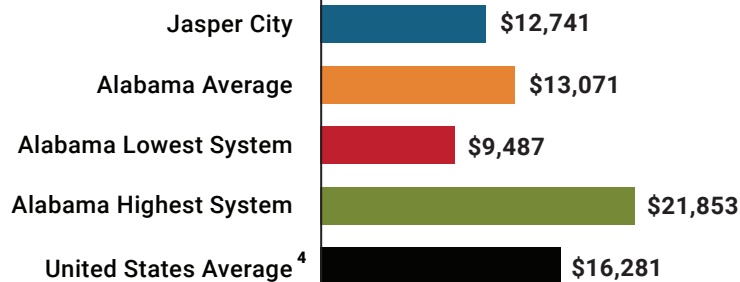

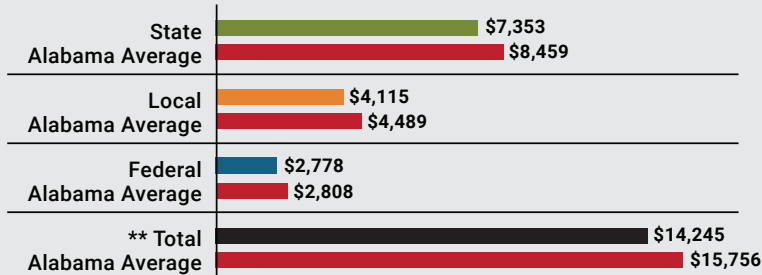

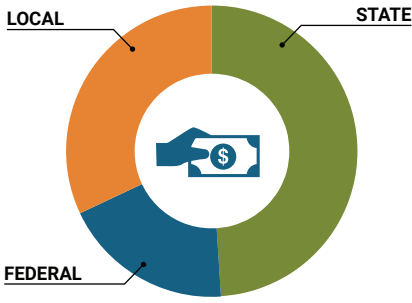

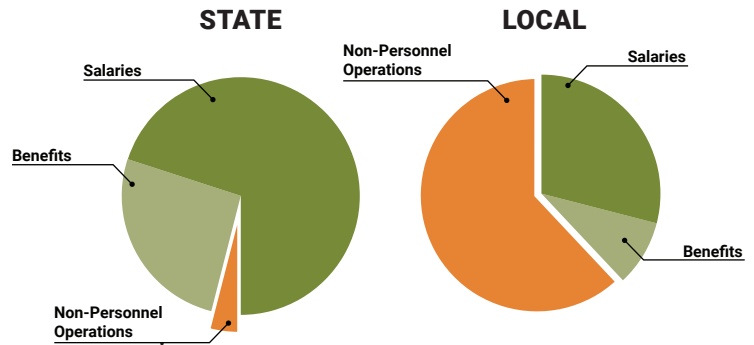

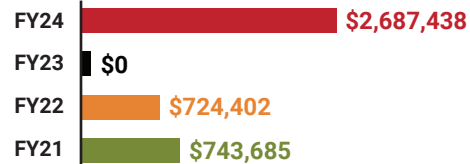


Only 4% of state funding is available for non-personnel expenditures⁴
