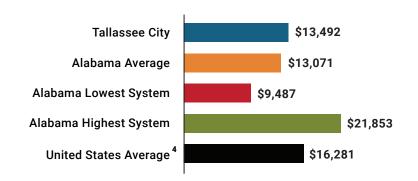

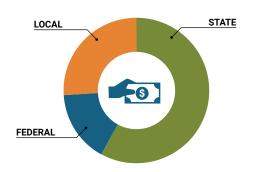


## OVERALL SYSTEM RANK 86
