

Elmore County Revenue Sources

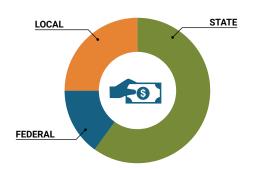


OVERALL SYSTEM RANK 136

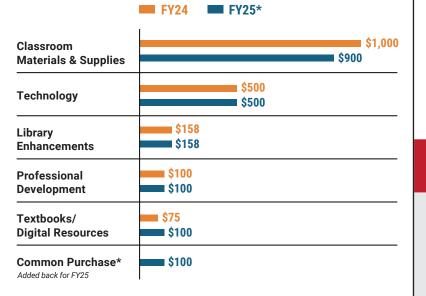
