

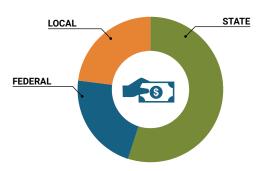


# OVERALL SYSTEM RANK 81

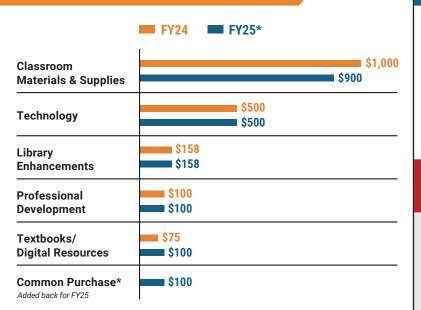
