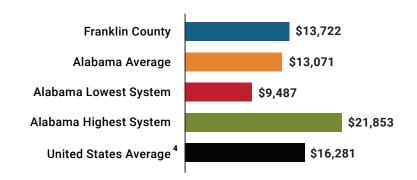

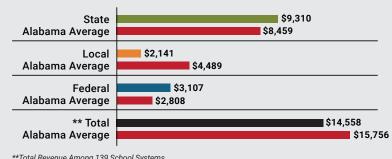

**Total Revenue Among 139 School Systems

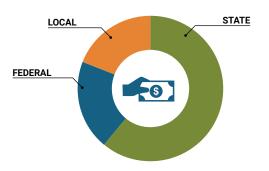

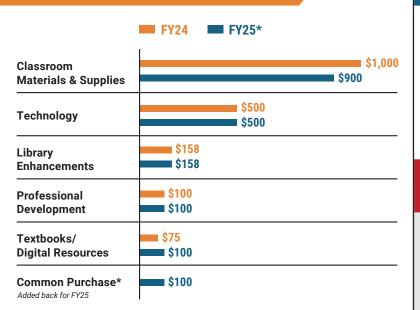

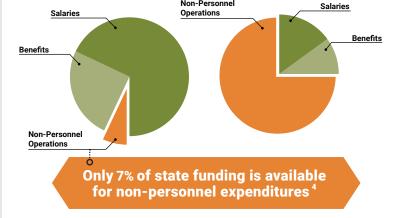
