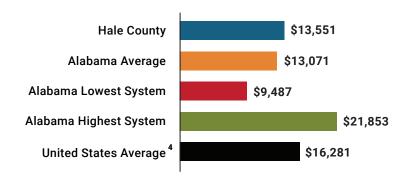

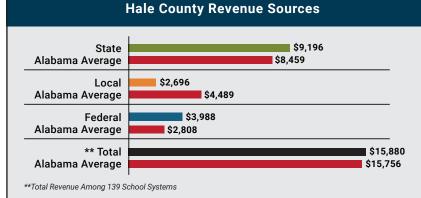

#### **Per-Pupil Revenue Sources**



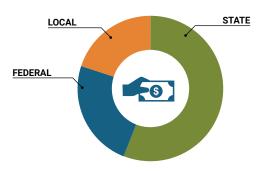

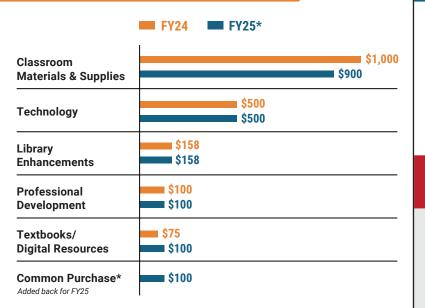

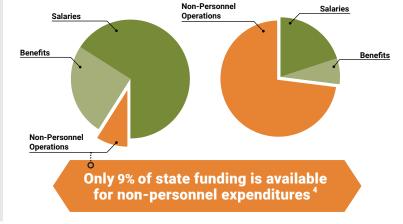
