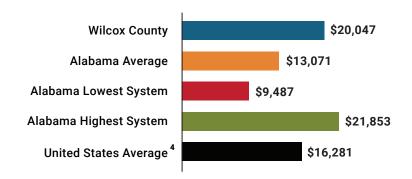

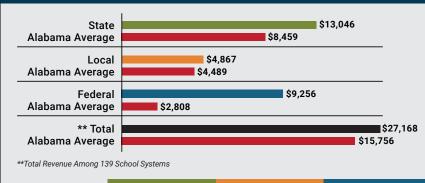

#### **Wilcox County Revenue Sources**



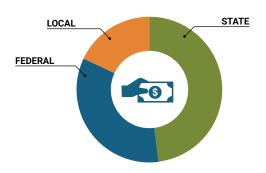


## OVERALL SYSTEM RANK $\mathbf{3}$

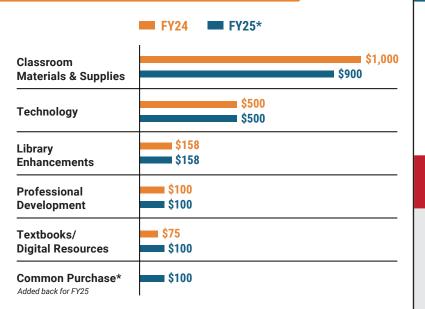
