

ETF & SUSTAINABLE FUNDING

- Fund dedicated line item for school safety and security.
- Lower ADM requirement for assistant principal and counselor earned units.
- Allow systems to carry over Educational Advancement & Technology Fund (EAT) dollars with more flexibility.
- Oppose any efforts to redirect or reduce any revenue currently dedicated to financing K-12 public education.
- Ensure local boards of education receive proportional share of online simplified sellers use tax (SSUT).
- Ensure any new public education employee benefit programs are cost effective and fully state funded.
- **Establish** joint legislative study commission that annually reviews and publishes report on fiscal impact of existing tax credits and exemptions.
- Oppose vendor-specific line item allocations.

CAPITAL OUTLAY WITH ONE-TIME SURPLUS

• Allocate up to \$1 billion in low-interest loans or direct appropriations from existing state education reserves for critical K-12 capital outlay needs.

MODERNIZING THE SCHOOL FUNDING FORMULA

- Align funding with student needs -- ensure program accurately reflects costs of a modernday education program, including changes in the education landscape since 1994, using current market costs to determine base funding.
- Increase per-pupil funding for all districts -preserve each local school board's current level
 of funding, allow for growth commensurate with
 new mandates, and regularly reassess funding
 base to calculate in real-time costs and growth,
 including pay raises for education personnel,
 transportation, and technology.
- Give more flexibility in allocating the funding systems receive through the state's funding formula.
- Ensure systems retain control over local funding.
- Phase in implementation consistent with conservative revenue projections and other budgetary needs.
- **Ensure** accountability provisions are reasonable and do not penalize students.



SCHOOL CHOICE ACCOUNTABILITY

- **Allow** school boards to receive average daily membership (ADM) for non-public school student enrollment in career and technical education (CTE) programs.
- **Limit** the negative academic and financial consequences of state-funded private school voucher and scholarship programs.
- Promote transparency and accountability for entities receiving public education funds.

SUPPORT LOCAL AUTHORITY

- Authorize flexibility in policy and funding items to meet student, staff, and community needs.
- **Preserve** local school board authority in local policy, curriculum and instruction, health and safety, and student discipline.
- Support legislation appointing superintendents.

By amplifying the voices of students, educators and communities who may otherwise go unheard, school boards fulfill an essential civic responsibility, ensuring policy decisions are informed by real challenges and opportunities facing public schools.

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
