### SBOE Approves FY26 Foundation Program Budget Request, New ACAP Cut Scores

The State Board of Education Thursday approved a requested increase of \$55 million for the Foundation Program in the FY26 Education Trust Fund (ETF) budget. The Board also established a new cut score for the lowest level in reading on the Alabama Comprehensive Assessment Program (ACAP), with several Board members sharing concerns from constituents and educators alike about the need for a higher cut score, and two dissenting members noting the new cut score is not high enough to prevent third graders not reading sufficiently from promotion to the fourth grade.

For fourth grade promotion under the Alabama Literacy Act, the lowest achievement level for the reading subtest of the ACAP is now set at the following raw scores and schedule:

- Previous 435 cut score for 2023-2024
- 444 cut score for 2024-2025
- 444 cut score for 2025-2026
- 454 cut score for 2026-2027

Other board meeting and work session discussion included updates on Social Studies and Arts Courses of Study and Samford University's undergraduate and graduate educator preparation programs.

  improve student learning.


Alabama law requires orientation for new school board members. AASB's course fulfills the state's orientation requirement as well as the state ethics course requirement for public officials. Newly seated board members must complete orientation within one year of the July 1 after taking office.



### Cybersecurity Pilot for Schools and Libraries

The Federal Communications Commission (FCC) recently launched the \$200 million, three-year Schools and Libraries Cybersecurity Pilot Program to explore how Universal Service funds can be used to help schools and libraries secure their broadband and computer networks against cyberattacks.
