SBOE Discusses FY26 ETF Budget Priorities

The State Board of Education discussed top priorities Thursday for next year's education budget, requesting a \$225 million increase for the Foundation Program and a significant \$52 million increase for struggling readers beyond 3rd grade in the FY26 Education Trust Fund (ETF) budget.

Deputy State Superintendent Brandon Payne detailed a breakdown of the proposed Alabama State Department of Education (ALSDE) FY26 ETF budget request of \$6.4 billion, a 7% increase over FY25. This does not include any one-time funds available in the ETF supplemental appropriation, which this year was \$651 million, with \$158.5 million earmarked for K-12 education. State Superintendent of Education Eric Mackey noted the Education Advancement and Technology Fund will have approximately \$1.6 billion available next year.

The requested FY26 Foundation Program will feature additional funding for assistant principals, which Mackey noted both the governor and legislative budget chairmen support.

Mackey said they have committed to decreasing the number of students required for an assistant principal from 300 students to 250 students, and to include elementary schools. He cautioned this number may look more like 275 students in this FY26 budget, with the goal to get down to 250 within the next of years. The requested Foundation Program increases also include fully funding transportation, which the Legislature has historically funded at around 81%, and a significant increase of \$26 million for special education teacher incentive stipends.

Place Certified Poverty Coaches in Your Schools



AASB is excited to host nationally known poverty expert Donna Beegle for two intensive training programs at our office in Montgomery **Sept. 24 - 27**. Protective Domain Name Service Available at No-cost to K-12 Schools

The White House Office of the National Cyber Director (ONCD) has launched an initiative to help K-12 school and district administrators understand the resources available to help them <u>combat emerging</u> cyber threats.

ONCD has identified protective domain name service (PDNS) as a common solution that all schools and districts should utilize.

PDNS helps prevent ransomware and other cyber attacks by preventing computer systems from connecting to harmful websites and other dangerous areas of the internet without the user having to take any action, stopping attacks before they happen.

One provider is the federal governmentfunded Multi-State Information Sharing and Analysis Center (MS-ISAC), which offers PDNS to schools for no-cost.


