About Monroe County Schools

Monroe County Schools (MCS) is a system rooted in tradition, resilience and a commitment to educational excellence. Schools across the county emphasize academic achievement, character development and community engagement.

Our school system is dedicated to academic innovation. Classrooms are equipped with modern technology, enabling students to engage in interactive learning experiences. MCS recently integrated EdGenuity, a new learning management system, and used grants to fund new computers and earbuds to ensure all students have access to the tools they need to succeed.

Career and technical education (CTE) also plays a crucial role in our system's offerings. During the 2023-2024 school year, students earned 168 industry-recognized certifications, including Microsoft Office Specialist, Certified Nursing Assistant and NCCER Core. Additional certifications were made available through a partnership with the Alabama Community College System Innovation Center. These initiatives empower our students with the skills and qualifications needed to excel in today's competitive job market. MCS has demonstrated measurable progress in student outcomes and notable improvements in college and career readiness, prompting recognition as one of Alabama's Top 25 Most Improved Schools.

The Alabama School Report Card indicates a 100% academic growth and 10-point increase in academic achievement school-wide for the 2023-2024 school year. In addition, 94% of third grade students are reading at or above the Alabama Literacy Act sufficiency level with a 100% promotion rate.

At MCS, we place a strong emphasis on extracurricular activities in effort to foster school spirit and provide students with opportunities to develop their talents. We proudly support the success of our athletics teams, including our 2023-2024 EXCEL softball and varsity football teams that reached statelevel competitions.

Blending academic rigor and personal development, MCS is dedicated to shaping future leaders who are prepared to contribute meaningfully to their communities and beyond.



The Monroe County Board of Education is seeking an experienced and dedicated leader with a strong background in driving student success to become its next superintendent. The board also is seeking a candidate who:

- Is visionary and goal oriented
- Creates a good working environment for all employees
- Is skilled in making data-driven decisions
- Demonstrates ability to improve student achievement
- Prepares students for college and careers
- Effectively leads an administrative team

QUALIFICATIONS

Alabama law requires the superintendent be chosen for general fitness and character and that he or she be knowledgeable in school administration. The candidate must hold at least a master's degree in education. An earned doctorate is preferred but not required. The successful applicant should have or be eligible for the appropriate certification to serve as a superintendent in Alabama. He or she must have experience as a classroom teacher and at least five years' experience in public school work. In addition, he or she must have worked for at least the last five years as a principal, administrator, assistant superintendent or superintendent. The successful candidate must also be qualified to be bonded by the school system's insurance carrier.

SALARY

The salary range is between \$145,000-\$175,000 based on experience and a proven track record.

Application Process

This search is being conducted by the Alabama Association of School Boards. All applications will be taken through Frontline, AASB's online application system, by visiting

<u>Applitrack.com/alabamaschoolboards/onlineapp</u>. If this is your first time applying for an AASB-led search via Frontline, you must first create a user account and password. Next, log in, complete the online profile, choose to apply for this search and upload a cover letter. You also must have an official transcript sent directly to AASB from the institution that granted the highest degree.

If you have previously applied to an AASB-led search and already have a Frontline account, simply log in, choose to apply for this search, answer the questions specific to this search and upload a cover letter. You may email

SuperintendentSearch@AlabamaSchoolBoards.org to have AASB upload the official copy of your transcript if it is not yet part of your online file; it is not necessary to have another copy sent.

A search committee will review all applications and recommend finalists to the school board. The board may interview some or all of the finalists. State law requires that these interviews be public.
